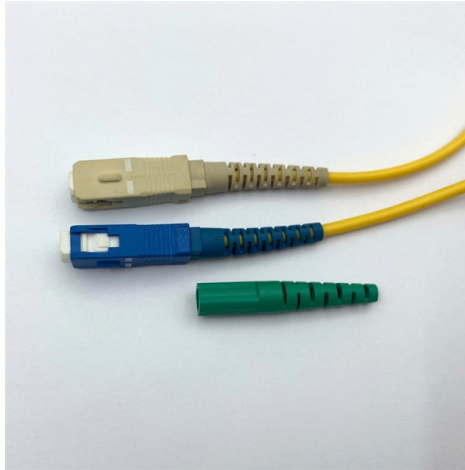

The cable sag is adjusted according to engineering specifications and is secured by the suspension clamps on poles and by dead- end clamps at the ends of the aerial line.
