Trays should comply with standards such as EN 50085 or UL94 V-0 for fire resistance and durability.
4. Installation Practices: Maintain proper bending radius and segregation of cables to prevent overheating and interference. Ensure structural support spans are adequate for the tray type and cable load. Perform regular inspections to check for cable wear, tray integrity, and secure fastening. Avoid running cables inside ducts unless specifically rated for that purpose, such as inline fan cabling.
5. Coordination with HVAC Systems: Engage both electrical and mechanical engineers to ensure that cable trays do not interfere with...
