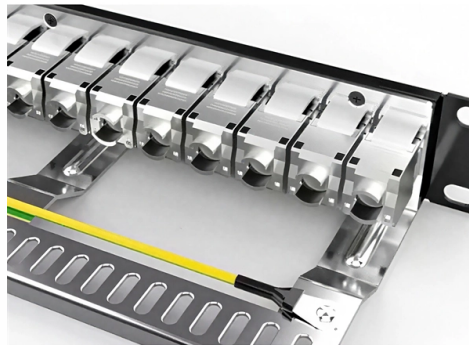


Can a fiber optic cable be used to connect the router



AI Overview

You cannot connect a fiber optic cable directly to a standard router; an Optical Network Terminal (ONT) is required to convert the optical signal into an electrical signal for the router. - Ethernet Cable (Cat5e or higher):** Connects the ONT to the router's WAN port.

Connection Steps

- Install the ONT:** Connect the fiber optic cable from the wall outlet to the ONT's optical port and power it on. Wait for the status lights to stabilize.
- Connect ONT to Router:** Use an Ethernet cable to link the ONT's LAN port to the router's WAN port.
- Power On the Router:** Turn on the router and wait for it to establish a connection. Verify connectivity on your devices.
- Configure Router Settings:** If required, log into the router's interface to enter ISP credentials or configure VLAN/PPPoE settings.

Special Cases Some high-end or enterprise routers have SFP ports that allow direct fiber connections without an ONT. These routers are designed to handle optical signals natively, but they are not common in typical home networks.
