

Can each optical port on an aggregation switch be configured



AI Overview

To configure the optical port of an aggregation switch, you need to set up port aggregation, assign VLANs, select the link type, and optionally enable LACP for dynamic negotiation.

Step 1: Verify Port Attributes Ensure that all physical ports intended for aggregation have consistent attributes: Port speed and duplex mode (full duplex only) Link type: trunk, hybrid, or access VLAN configuration: permitted VLANs and port VLAN ID (PVID) STP settings: enable/disable, priority, and cost Consistency ensures proper aggregation and avoids misconfigurations.

Step 2: Choose Aggregation Mode You can configure the optical port in one of the following modes: Static (ON mode): Adds the port to a static aggregation group without LACP negotiation. Supports up to 8 ports per group. Dynamic (LACP): Uses the Link Aggregation Control Protocol to negotiate with the peer device. Two sub-modes: Active: Port initiates LACP negotiation Passive: Port responds to LACP negotiation Dynamic groups can contain up to 12 ports, with 8 active and 4 backup.

Step 3: Configure VLANs and Link Type Assign the optical port to the correct VLAN(s) and set the link type: Access port: single VLAN Trunk port: multiple VLANs Hybrid port: combination of tagged and untagged VLANs Ensure VLANs match across all aggregated ports to maintain logical channel integrity.

Step 4: Configure Load Balancing After aggregation, select a load balancing method to distribute traffic across physical ports: MAC-based: src-mac, dst-mac, or both-mac IP-based: src-ip, dst-ip, or both-ip This ensures efficient utilization of bandwidth and prevents congestion on a single port.

Step 5: Connect and Verify Insert the appropriate SFP/SFP+ optical module into the port Connect fiber to the peer switch or edge device Verify the port channel status and LACP activity using CLI commands or the network management...

Link aggregation can also be used in an uplink between two switches or between a switch and a router or between two routers. NOTE: From the host end, this can also be called NIC teaming;

Link Aggregation: Static vs Dynamic, LACP, and MLAG Configuration

Static link aggregation is manually configured and does not rely on any negotiation protocol. Each side of the connection must be manually configured to include the same physical ports.

Configure at least one active mode aggregation in two devices. For a successful static aggregation, make sure the ports at both ends of each link are in the same aggregation state.
