

Core Switch Board Replacement

Replacing a core switch requires careful planning, pre-configuration, and consideration of downtime, hardware, and network topology to ensure a smooth migration.

Planning and Preparation Before replacing a core switch, assess your current network requirements: number of ports, Layer 2/3 capabilities, VLANs, ACLs, QoS, PoE needs, and storage traffic like iSCSI or NFS (). Evaluate cost versus features, including stacking, Layer 3 routing, and management software.

Migration Strategies There are two main approaches:

- All-at-once replacement:** Schedule downtime, pre-configure the new switch with all SVIs, VLANs, and routing, then disconnect the old switch and connect the new one. This is simpler if downtime is acceptable and avoids IP conflicts ().
- Staged migration:** Bring the new switch online alongside the old one, migrate connections VLAN by VLAN, and gradually transfer services. This minimizes downtime but requires careful planning to avoid IP conflicts and routing issues ().

Configuration Transfer Pre-configure the new switch with SVIs, VLANs, ACLs, routing protocols, and management settings (). Verify interface mapping and connectivity.

Test configurations in a lab or simulation if possible (). Ensure loopback addresses and IPs do not conflict during migration ().

Execution Tips Schedule the replacement during off-peak hours or weekends to minimize business impact (). Document all connections, ports, and configurations. Prepare a rollback plan in case of unexpected issues (). Test connectivity immediately after migration, including uplinks, VLANs, and routing.
