- Safety Information:** Include warnings, PPE requirements, and last update date. High-voltage circuits may require "DANGER - HIGH VOLTAGE - KEEP OUT" signage in accordance with NFPA 70E and ANSI Z535 standards.
- Additional Notes:** For complex systems, labels may include information about smart monitoring, energy management, or alternate power sources like generators.
