Components of a Single-Phase Distribution Box

- Main MCB (Double Pole):** Acts as the main switch controlling the entire DB. Usually rated higher (e.g., 63A).
- RCCB (Residual Current Circuit Breaker):** Provides protection against leakage currents, electrical shocks, and insulation faults. Typically rated at 30mA for domestic installations.
- Branch MCBs (Single or Double Pole):** Control individual circuits such as lighting, kitchen, or outdoor outlets.
- Neutral and Earth Bars:** Distribute neutral and earth connections to all circuits.

Circuit Diagram Marking

- Single-Line Diagram:** Represent the DB schematically with lines showing connections from the main supply to the main MCB, then to RCCB, and finally to branch MCBs.
- Numbering Scheme:** Assign an Electrical Identification Number to the DB (e.g., SWB-01). Prefix each circuit with the DB ID and a sequential number (e.g., SWB-01-C1 for the first circuit). In multi-bus systems, label circuits according to bus sections (A/B) and ascending order of importance: incomers, transformer feeders, and plant loads.

Labeling on Equipment:

- Main MCB:** "MAIN 230V DB – SWB-01"
- RCCB:** Include rating and DB reference
- Branch MCBs:** Label with specific load or area (e.g., "Kitchen Outlets East Wall"). Use durable labels or a label maker; avoid masking tape.

Safety and Verification:

- Maintain an up-to-date single-line diagram near the DB for quick isolation and maintenance.
- Test each circuit with a circuit finder or voltage tester to confirm labeling accuracy.
- Ensure labels are legible and resistant to fading or smudging.

Best Practices

- Start numbering from the main incomer and proceed sequentially through branch circuits.
- Include circuit type, load description, and breaker rating on labels.
- Keep a digital or printed record of all circuits for future reference.
- Update labels whenever circuits are added or modified to prevent hazard...
