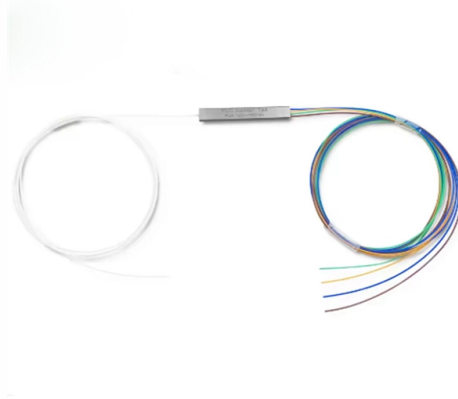

Code violations: NEC requires each conductor to terminate on its own terminal unless the breaker or lug is explicitly rated for multiple wires. Proper Practices Use breakers or lugs rated for multiple conductors: Some breakers allow two wires per terminal; always check manufacturer specifications. Terminate stranded wires correctly: Use ferrules or crimped lugs to prevent strands from fraying and ensure a secure connection. Avoid forcing wires: Never cut or strip strands to fit multiple wires into a single lug; this weakens the conductor and increases risk. Neutral and ground bars: Each neutral or ground conductor should have its own terminal unless the bar is designed for multiple wires. Summary While stranded wires are common in distribution boxes, double-strand connections must be handled carefully. Only use terminals rated for multiple conductors, secure stranded wires with ferrules or proper lugs, and follow NEC guidelines to prevent overheating, tripping, and code violations.
