- Performance metrics:** Split ratio, insertion loss, uniformity, and isolation determine network efficiency.

Types of Splitters

- PLC (Planar Lightwave Circuit) Splitters:** Compact, reliable, and suitable for high split ratios across a wide wavelength range.
- FBT (Fused Biconical Taper) Splitters:** Traditional method, often used for lower split ratios, with slightly higher insertion loss variability.

Fiber Routing and Splitter Placement

- Centralized Splitting:** Splitters are located at a central office or cabinet. This allows flexible customer-to-splitter assignments using jumpers, simplifying maintenance and reconfiguration.
- Distributed Splitting:** Splitters are placed closer to the end users, often in closures or pedestals. Once installed, fiber assignments are fixed, and routing is less flexible.
- Unbalanced Splits / Optical Taps:** Some distributed designs use 1x2 splitters with unequal power outputs along the route to optimize signal strength for different distances. Routing fibers through splitters involves con...

A fiber broadband provider typically determines and overall split ratio for the network, such as 1x32 or 1x64, and uses combinations of splitters to meet that ratio with each PON port.

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
