Safety compliance: This setup ensures two-layer protection, with RCDs at both the tertiary (device) and secondary (zone) levels, minimizing the risk of electrical faults. Practical Implications If a project has multiple devices, each device requires its own tertiary distribution box or a dedicated circuit within a larger tertiary panel. The total number of devices a tertiary distribution system can support depends on the number of individual circuits installed, not the physical size of the box alone. For construction sites or residential areas, this approach ensures high safety, reliability, and compliance with electrical standards. In summary, a single tertiary distribution box supports one device per circuit, and the overall capacity is determined by the number of circuits provided in the tertiary distribution setup. This ensures independent protection and adherence to hierarchical distribution principles.
