

How to connect a router to fiber optic cable inside the wall

Step 4: Configure the Router Access your router's admin panel via a web browser using its IP address (commonly 192.168.1.1). Enter any ISP-provided credentials if required and update the firmware to ensure optimal performance.

Step 5: Optional Wall Plate Setup If you want a clean installation through the wall, you can use a fiber keystone jack or wall plate. Run a short fiber patch cable from the wall plate to the ONT, and use standard Ethernet cabling for connections to other rooms. Avoid attempting to convert fiber directly to RJ45 without an ONT, as this will degrade signal quality.

Step 6: Test the Connection Connect a device to the router via Wi-Fi or Ethernet and run a speed test to verify the fiber connection. If there are issues, reboot the ONT and router or contact your ISP for support. By following these steps...
