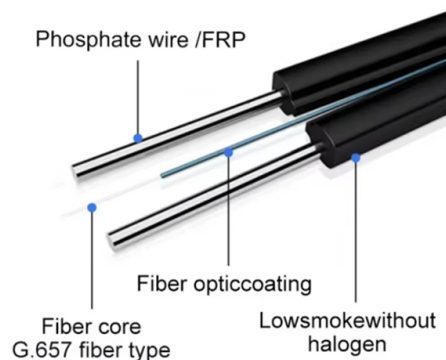


How to install a fiber optic panel on a wall

Step 4: Prepare and Route Fiber Cables Strip the fiber jacket carefully, exposing the fiber without damaging it. Maintain a minimum bend radius (typically >30mm) to prevent signal loss or breakage. Route the fiber into the enclosure through the entry port, coiling any excess slack neatly inside.

Step 5: Splice or Connect Fibers Fusion-splice the incoming fiber to pre-terminated pigtails inside the enclosure, or use mechanical connectors if applicable. Insert the pigtail connectors into the corresponding adapters on the panel. Snap the faceplate onto the enclosure to protect the connections.

Step 6: Test and Secure Measure light levels using a power meter or OTDR to ensure proper signal strength (e.g., -8 dBm to -27 dBm for GPON networks). Ensure all fibers are secured, dust caps are in place on unused ports, and the enclosure is closed properly...
