Avoid sharp 90-degree turns and use large-radius fittings to prevent micro-bends or macro-bends that can degrade signal quality. Proper Pulling Techniques Never pull directly on the glass fiber. Use the strength members (e.g., Kevlar yarn or central rod) to bear the pulling force. This prevents internal damage that may not be visible but can cause signal loss later. Check the cable datasheet for maximum pull force limits. Separation and Organization Keep fiber optic cables separate from power cables to reduce interference and maintain signal integrity. Use dividers or separate trays if necessary. Organize cables neatly using Velcro straps or cable ties, avoiding tight bundling that can stress the fibers.
