

Marking of multimode optical cables

Multimode optical cables are marked using standardized color codes for outer jackets, individual fibers, and connectors according to the TIA-598-D/C standard, ensuring accurate identification and safe installation.

Outer Jacket Color The outer jacket of a multimode fiber cable provides the first visual cue for fiber type. Standard multimode cables are typically marked with orange, black, or gray jackets, while single-mode cables use yellow for contrast. For hybrid cables containing multiple fiber types, a printed legend on the jacket specifies the distribution, e.g., "12 Fiber: 8 x 50/125, 4 x 62.5/125". Custom jacket colors can also be used if clearly labeled and agreed upon with the manufacturer.

Inner Fiber Color Sequence Inside a multimode cable, each individual fiber strand is color-coded to allow easy identification during splicing, termination, and troubleshooting. The TIA-598-C/D standard defines a 12-color sequence: Blue, Orange, Green, Brown, Slate (Gray), White, Red, Black, Yellow, Violet, Rose, Aqua. For cables with more than 12 fibers, the sequence repeats with added stripe markers or tube-based identification for high-count cables. For example, fiber #13 would be Blue with a black stripe, or in a multi-tube system, the tube color identifies the group and the fiber color identifies the strand within that tube.

Connector and Boot Color Connectors also follow color conventions to indicate fiber type and polish style: UPC (Ultra Physical Contact): Blue boot, low insertion loss (~0.2 dB) APC (Angled Physical Contact): Green boot, angled end-face reduces back reflection (
