Wire Size: Select wire gauge according to load; for example, 2.5mm^2 for lighting and sockets, 4mm^2 for air conditioning or heavy loads. Connection Method: Each outgoing wire is connected to the output terminal of its respective breaker. Terminal blocks or busbars are used for neat distribution. Cable Management: Wires should be tied with plastic ties, routed straight, and spaced evenly to avoid tangling or mechanical stress. Safety: Ensure proper earthing, insulation, and compliance with local electrical codes. Perform visual checks and multimeter tests before powering the system.
