- Fire Ratings:** Ensure the cable has the appropriate UL flame rating (e.g., OFN, OFNR) for the building environment.
- Mechanical Durability:** Tray-rated cables are tested for long-term mechanical performance, including resistance to abrasion, impact, and bending.
- Bend Radius:** Maintain the manufacturer-specified minimum bend radius to prevent fiber damage, especially in ladder or perforated trays.
- Environmental Exposure:** For outdoor or harsh industrial environments, select cables rated for temperature extremes and UV exposure if trays are exposed.

Installation Tips

- Use ladder or ventilated trays to allow airflow and reduce heat buildup, which can affect cable performance.
- Avoid overfilling trays; consult the manufacturer for tray fill capacity guidance, as NEC does not specify limits for optical fiber cables.
- Secure cables with ties or clamps without exceeding the recommended tension to prevent crushing or microbending.
