- LC (Lucent Connector):** Miniaturized version of SC with a 1.25mm ferrule, ideal for high-density applications. Uses a latch mechanism similar to RJ45 plugs.
- ST (Straight Tip):** Features a bayonet-style twist-lock, commonly used in legacy systems, industrial, and military networks.
- FC (Ferrule Connector):** Threaded coupling for secure connections in high-vibration environments like factories or railway systems.
- MTP/MPO:** Multi-fiber connectors used for high-density applications, such as data centers, supporting multiple fibers in a single connector.

Single-Mode vs Multimode Connectors are also categorized based on fiber type: single-mode connectors are optimized for long-distance, low-loss transmission, while multimode connectors are used for shorter distances with higher light dispersion tolerance.

Polishing types, such as UPC (Ultra Physical Contact) and APC (Angled Physical Contact), further affect performance by reducing back reflection.
