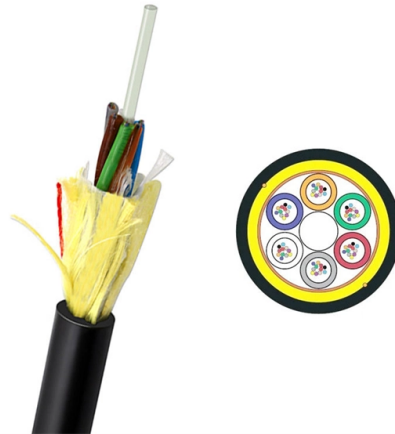


What is a mobile core switch
