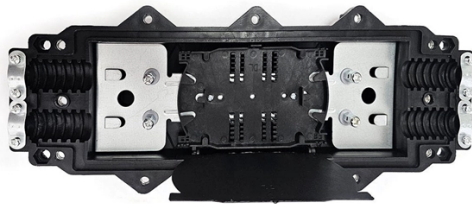

Ensure all metal frames, doors, and panels are reliably connected to the ground using bare copper flexible wire.
5. Cable Entry and Sealing: Use flameproof compression glands and double sealing with flameproof putty at wall penetrations. Maintain the shortest cable paths with maximum protection to reduce risk of sparks.
6. Internal Wiring Arrangement: Arrange wires neatly and tie them into bundles with nylon tape. Maintain proper creepage and clearance distances for all live conductors. Ensure layered distribution wiring considers trunking in and out for organized routing.
7. Verification and Testing: After wiring, re-tighten all internal fasteners and check conductor connections. Clean the interior of the box and label a...
